



Plant Enters Test Phase

Testing at the Lamar Repowering Project, a coal-fired power plant, started today to ensure that certain repairs and modifications are functioning properly. These modifications were required to meet the emissions requirements of its air permit.

"We have been working with our boiler manufacturer and the State of Colorado to make sure these modifications are done correctly," says interim general manager Rick Rigel. "We are committed to ensuring that our facility meets or exceeds all state and federal emissions requirements."

The plant was originally commissioned in 2009, but ARPA suspended operations in December 2010 to repair certain steam pipes and make the required modifications. While the plant has been offline, ARPA has been purchasing electricity through the Municipal Energy Agency of Nebraska to provide uninterrupted electric service to its member municipalities.



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
