

LAMAR POWER PLANT DEMOLITION

The Arkansas River Power Authority (ARPA) will begin the demolition of its Lamar Power Plant in January 2021. The work will consist of total removal of the power plant equipment including the conveyor system over Maple Street and the boiler and stack on the south side of Maple Street. Discussion regarding the North Side property, including the conveyors and coal domes, is currently underway between ARPA, the City of Lamar, and a 3rd party interested in re-purposing the property into an agricultural processing facility.

DEMOLITION SCHEDULE

The current schedule indicates the structural demolition of the South Plant is expected to begin in January, 2021 and be complete by the end of March, 2021. The South Plant is the property on the south side of Maple Street and east of 2nd Street. Demolition, or re-purposing, of the North Plant, the area between Maple Street and the domes, is yet to be determined pending the outcome of discussion between the City of Lamar, ARPA and a 3rd party. If a decision is made to demolish the North Side property, the work will begin once the South Plant work is complete.

CONVEYOR TUBE OVER MAPLE STREET

When the work begins to remove the conveyor tube over Maple Street, it is anticipated that Maple Street will be closed for no more than 2 days. Signage will be posted five-days prior to the planned street closing. During this time of the street closure you will need to use an alternate route.

PARKING

Parking for the construction workers will be inside the gated fencing between Commercial Street and 1st Street. It is not anticipated that street parking or street traffic in the area will be impacted other than the expected street closing mentioned above. If there is any additional impact, you will be notified in advance. Parking at your residence should continue as usual.
