Mobile Substation Placed into Service at Trinidad- ARPA Operating Committee holds Mobile Substation Training: Trinidad Municipal Power and Light had ARPA place its Mobile Substation into operation in order for its electric utility to perform substation upgrades without taking a power outage. In conjunction with the installation, the ARPA members conducted a training session regarding the substations interconnection and operating procedures.

ARPA Holds its Annual Hurt Man/Bucket Truck Rescue Training: Thirty-one line workers from the ARPA members turned out in La Junta for ARPA's annual Hurt-Man/Pole Top Bucket Truck rescue training. This year's training included Self-Rescue safety equipment training provided by SAFETY ONE. The self-rescue equipment for the Member's bucket trucks was purchased with funds from Guzman Energy and ARPA.



April 2026 Financial and Operating Statements

Summary: During the month of April, revenue from power sales was 2% less than budget and year to date, power sales are approximately 5.7% less than budget. Total cost of goods sold was under budget (5.9%). Transmission expense for the month was approximately 12% higher than 2025, however, transmission expense is still within budget, as are both power supply and A&G. ARPA's

hydro allocation from the Western Area Power Administration provided approximately 26% of the monthly resources, wind provided 6% and supplemental power purchases rounded out the power purchases for April.

Next ARPA Meeting: The next regularly scheduled meeting of the ARPA Board of Directors is Thursday, August 27, 2026. The meeting will be held in La Junta at Otero College Student Center, 2001 San Juan.
